Directions to Pats Peak:

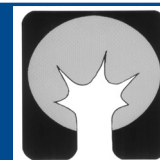
From the West: Take I-89 South to Exit 5 (Route 202/9 West). Proceed on Route 202/9 West to the Henniker Exit (Route 114). Follow Route 114 South. Go straight through the center of town for approximately 2 miles and look for Pats Peak on your right. Take the right and follow the road to the Pats Peak entrance.

From the East (Concord): Take I-89 North. Take Exit 5 (a left hand exit). Follow Route 202/9 West. Take the Henniker Exit (Route 114). Follow Route 114 South. Go straight through the center of town for approximately 2 miles and look for Pats Peak sign on your right. Take the right and follow the road to the Pats Peak entrance.

Watch for signs for the door to enter.

The Lasting Legacy of New Hampshire's Sheep Boom - Steve Taylor, farmer and retired NH Commissioner of Agriculture

For about 30 years in the early 19th century the hills of New Hampshire were home to hundreds of thousands of sheep. Most of the land south of the White Mountains was cleared for pastures and to grow hay for these animals, which were raised to produce wool. Fortunes were made by many in what was the only period of true agricultural prosperity the state has ever known. The money made with sheep enabled the construction of many fine homes and public buildings which endure today, and the need to confine sheep led to the construction of thousands of miles of stone walls, another feature of the Great Sheep Boom that helps to define the state's landscape today.
