Fire Season of 1927

Twenty fires occured in Coos County during the season of 1927, eight of which were in the Town of Berlin, two in Jefferson, two in Northumberland, two in Stratford, two in Gorham, and one each in the Towns of Stewartstown, Dalton, Wentworth Location and Dartmouth College Grant. Almost all of these fires occured during the month of April and early May and did but little damcge owing to the fact that snow was still in the woods.

The Dartmouth College Grant fire was caused, without doubt, by pulpwood cutters, and burned over approximately three hundred acres, practically all cut-over land.

Patrol

Twenty-two patrolmen were employed, eighteen of them for the entire season and four for short periods.

Owing to the fact that the old slash on the west branch of the Magalloway is well rotted down and green bushes up, it was thought best

to co-operate with the Maine Forestry District in that territory by paying their patrolman a part of his expenses and placing the man that was formerly there on the west branch of Dead Diamond on account of the immense amount of cut-over lands in that vicinity.

¹The Brown Company in co-operation with the Maine Commission maintained a patrol route on the west side of Aziscohos Lake and another patrolman was placed on the Little Magalloway water shed and paid jointly by the Maine Commission and this Association.

Thirteen small fires were extinguished by the patrolmen and 5166 persons were warned to be careful of fire while in the woods.
